Pursuant to the special master's Unpublished Decision Awarding Damages, filed March 25, 2014, it was held that petitioner is entitled to an award.

- B. A lump sum payment of \$4,686.71, representing compensation for satisfaction of the State of North Carolina Medicaid lien, payable jointly to petitioner and Division of Medical Assistance, Office of the Controller, 2022 Mail Service Center, Raleigh, NC 27699-2022, Medicaid/Health Choice ID: 950386521M. Petitioner agrees to endorse this payment to the State of North Carolina.
